So today, I want to talk about being Trustworthy, which is the first point of the Scout Law. A Scout is Trustworthy. Being trustworthy is like being a superhero! If you say you'll help, or you say you'll try your best, it's like putting on your superhero cape. And when you do what you say, you're showing everyone that they can count on you.

It is no mistake that Trustworthy is the first point of the Scout Law. All other points of the Scout Law build on this one.

Remember: always do your best, keep your promises, and be someone others can count on. That's what being trustworthy is all about!
