
2016 INTERNATIONAL SCOUTING CONFERENCE

Spotlight on the UK Scout Activity Centres



We're looking for volunteers from all over the world who want to have fun, make friends, and get qualified. Each year, we recruit up to 100 volunteers, from more than 30 countries, to help run our activity centres across the UK.

What Will You Be Doing? Our volunteers help with all aspects of running our centres, so no two days will be the same! For example, volunteers may be lead a kayaking session, check in guests, clean lodges and toilets, or possibly run a wide game for 50 Scouts. They'll be responsible for helping our visitors have a quality experience at Scout Activity Centres.

What Is Included? In return for our volunteers' hard work, we provide all food, accommodations, and uniforms for the duration of placement. All volunteers also receive a weekly allowance to cover out-of-pocket expenses. They'll receive comprehensive training and experience across a wide range of areas, plus the opportunity to attend accredited courses and gain recognized qualifications.

INTERNATIONAL SPIRIT AWARD UPDATE

The International Spirit Award is a temporary emblem that is awarded to registered Scouts and Scouters who have completed the necessary requirements, have gained a greater knowledge of international Scouting, and have a greater appreciation and awareness of different cultures and countries.



The International Spirit Award application has been updated. Effective September 1, 2015, the new application must be used as there have been changes to the requirements. International Spirit Award emblems are \$4 each and are purchased from the International Department.

COUNCIL INTERNATIONAL EVENT GUIDELINE

If your council is planning to host international Scouts as participants at a local council event, the International Department will work with your event registrar to verify that contingent leaders and International Service Team (IST/staff) members are registered and approved by their own WOSM Scout association to attend your event.

This may seem like an unnecessary step in your event planning, but it can be crucial to your event's success. At a previous large-council event, only 85 percent of the contingent leaders and 78 percent of the IST that applied were approved by their Scout association. Contact the International Department to verify the registration and approval of your international Scouts.

UPCOMING CHANGES TO BSA CONTINGENT SUPPORT

With more than 160 member organizations within the World Organization of the Scout Movement (WOSM), there are many international Scouting events each year. They provide a great opportunity for our BSA members to connect with the world, to learn about other countries, people, and cultures through Scouting activities, and make new friendships as part of their Scouting adventure.

In the past, the International Department has performed the coordination and planning of BSA contingents to some of these events. For the most part, these contingents were very similar to your own units' planning and participation for adventures.

The International Department is in the process of updating our process to support BSA members interested in attending international Scouting events, but will no longer act as the coordinator and planner of participation at these events.

An important part of the change in our process will be the elimination of the current BSA Contingent Nomination process and the addition of the BSA Contingent Leader Nomination process.

JAMBOREE 2017 IN DENMARK

Approximately 40,000 Scouts will be meeting in Denmark for Europe's largest jamboree of 2017! The five Danish Scout associations will come together, along with 6,000 international participants, in southern Denmark to make Jamboree Denmark 2017.

The jamboree will take place close to the German border and is easy to access from Hamburg or Copenhagen. The camp will run from the 22nd to 30th July and could easily be combined with visits to other locations across Europe. This is a fantastic opportunity to give your Scouts an international experience of Scouting and to make an exciting trip to Northern Europe.

A Danish jamboree is all about life together at the camp. Groups will cook their own food over open fire, and the focus will be on interacting and living with the thousands of Scouts around you. There will be three "travel" days with activities on- and off-site. Another day will be a subcamp activity day. This leaves another three days for free activities. There will be many opportunities to participate in walk-in activities, go on hikes to the beaches and

forests, or maybe spend a night out under the stars. The area surrounding the camp is rich in nature, history, and culture with many options to explore.

Scouting in Denmark is for boys and girls, and has high standards of safety. The organizers will be ready to assist BSA groups with all their arrangements

and give practical

advice. There will be a great focus on making sure that whatever your language is, you will be able to participate fully in the

jamboree. The jamboree organizers will also be able to offer advice on options before or after the jamboree, such as stayovers in Copenhagen, Scout centres in Denmark, or other locations nearby.

What: Jamboree Denmark 2017

When: 22–30 July 2017

Where: Sønderborg, Southern Denmark, with easy connections to Copenhagen and Hamburg, Germany

Who: The primary age group is 10 to 17, but it is open to all ages. There are options for Venturers and younger Scouts, families, and staff. You can come as your own Scout unit or as a mix of units.

Temperatures: Average daytime temperatures will be around 70 degrees Fahrenheit in July.

How many: There will be 40,000 participants, of which 6,000 will be international participants.

Have you been camping in real woods? Roihu is the must-see summer camp of 15 000 Scouts and Guides in the Finnish forest! We are expecting 1 500 participants from all over the world to come and experience the Finnish summer.

Roihu 2016 is the 7th International Finnjamboree organised by the Guides and Scouts of Finland. The previous Finnjamborees were Kilke (2010) and Tarus (2004). It is to be held in the Evo campsite in Southern Finland, near the town Hämeenlinna. The camp starts on July 20th 2016 and ends on July 28th 2016. The campsite is a pine and spruce forest, surrounded by beautiful lakes.

The camp will be run in three languages: English, Finnish and Swedish. All participants will have a program of their own age group: **trackers** (12-15-year-olds), **explorers** (15-17) and **rovers** (18-22). The activities will take place in "valleys" where Guides and Scouts have for instance a chance to do Guiding/ Scouting activities in real woods - safety taking naturally into account. The area of Evo will offer good opportunities also to water activities, being placed in proximity of several lakes. There are several joint activities for the

whole camp as well, such as the opening and closing ceremonies - and of course a big campfire, a roihu.

The camp fee would be around **220-240€** including programme, meals (served, no need for own cooking gear) and accommodation in your own tents. Roihu camp fee is based on the number of participants. The more Guides and Scouts we have, the lower the fee will be. So bring your friends along!

Home Hospitality is offered just before the camp starts and gives you an excellent opportunity to experience how Finnish people live. We are also offering a trip around Finland right after the camp (for extra fee). Both options will take around 3 days. There will be different kind of trips to choose from. Trips and HH will have their own price tag.

The camp registration is open until 24.01.2016. You are welcome to have the experience of your life!

We are looking forward to seeing you at Roihu 2016!



ABOUT FINLAND

Finland has about 5,5 million inhabitants and two official languages, Finnish and Swedish. The country is up to 80% covered with woods and 10% with lakes. Approximately 188 000 of the lakes are bigger than 500 square meters and smaller lakes exist beyond count. The biggest lake is Lake Saimaa in south eastern Finland. The Finnish archipelago is the largest in the world, with almost 180 000 islands and skerries.

Aurora Borealis, or northern lights, are usually associated with cold nights, but occur all year around when the Sun is active. They are best seen during clear weather against a dark night sky and are more common in the north than in the south.

Both girls and boys, Finnish and Swedish speakers are united under the same organisation - the Guides and Scouts of Finland (Suomen Partiolaiset - Finlands Scouter). We have 65 000 members in 850 local groups. The Guides and Scouts of Finland is a member of both the World Association of the Girl Guides and Girl Scouts (WAGGGS) and World Organisation of the Scout Movement (WOSM) and the only Guide and Scout organisation in Finland.
