

Accessible Scout materials all in one place!

Scouting is a rich and rewarding life experience. One important part of becoming a Scout is reading Scout books and manuals. From hiking and camping to reading and citizenship, Scouting materials provide valuable lessons. Through a partnership with Bookshare®, Scouts, unit leaders, and parents with qualified print disabilities can get accessible versions of their Scouting materials all in one place!

Bookshare is an online library of accessible e-books that allows readers with print disabilities to listen to books, see words and hear them read as they are highlighted on a screen, read in Braille, and much more! Bookshare has more than 100,000 books, including Scout materials, which can be read on desktop computers, laptops, Apple iPads, iPhones, iPod touches, MP3 players, and other assistive technology. Memberships are FREE for U.S. students; non-students will get a \$25 waiver for their setup fee and pay just \$50 annually. All members receive free reading software.

- **\$25 setup fee waiver for non-students** (use promo code: SCOUTS)
- **Extensive collections** of books and periodicals:
 - Scouting merit badge pamphlets and manuals.
 - A large collection of children's books and literature, even for young readers.
 - A wide selection of newspapers and magazines.
 - Textbooks for elementary school, high school, college, and graduate school.
- Digital books that can be read using a computer, most assistive reading devices, Apple iPad, iPhone, and iPod touch, or converted to an MP3 format.
- **FREE assistive software** for multi-modal reading
 - (synchronized text and audio): Victor Reader Soft from HumanWare and Read:OutLoud from Don Johnston (PC and Mac).



How Do You Get Started with Bookshare?

- Sign up for Bookshare: Visit www.bookshare.org and select "Individual Membership" under "Sign Up Today!" Make sure to use promo code: SCOUTS.
- Download and install free reading tools from the "Reading Tools" section under "Getting Started" on the Bookshare website.
- Find Scout books by searching or browsing for books on the Bookshare website.
- Tell your child's teacher about Bookshare! Schools join Bookshare for free, and your child can get books, including textbooks, at school. Have your school sign up at www.bookshare.org.
