We are grateful for your support of our 67 councils as Scouting builds our future leadership.

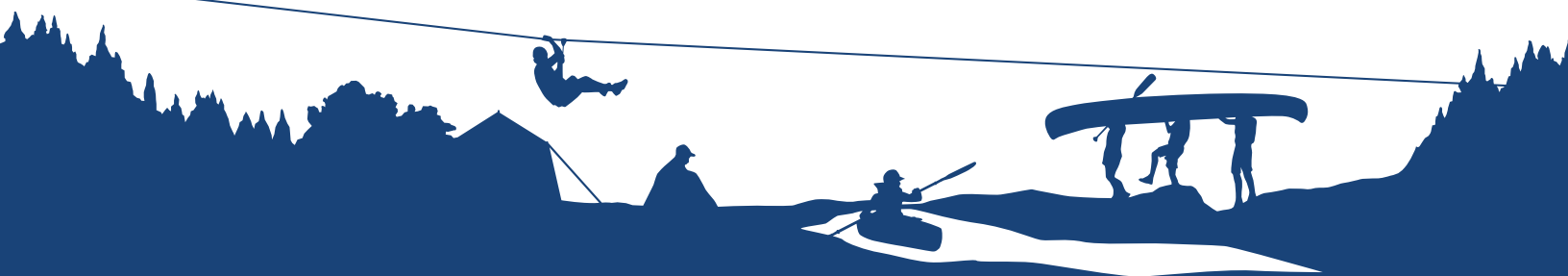

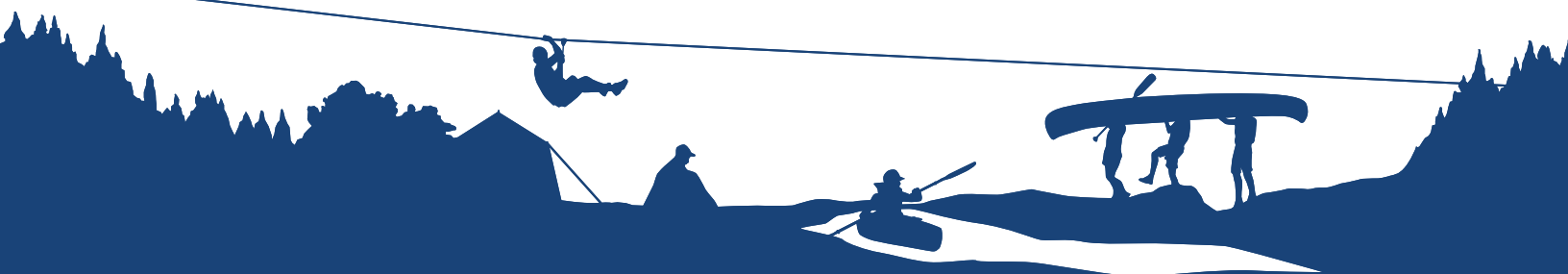
